

Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven

We have all kind of keys to protect our valued possessions: a house key, a car key, a safety box key, etc. And we will not just entrust this key to anybody. Handing them to somebody entails a great trust.

Thus we can only assume that it is with such a deep trust, Jesus hands to Peter the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. And with it comes the power and responsibility: "I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bound on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Indeed, Peter was given a special authority too, as a leader of the community that Our Lord has established.

But why was Peter chosen above the rest, only the Lord knows. Peter has his strengths but we are very much aware also of his weaknesses. Probably Our Lord knows that the acceptance of his own limitations will keep him humble when he assumes the position.

But the one thing we are certain is that the confession of Peter of Jesus as 'the Messiah, the Son of the living God" precedes his appointment. Such a confession of faith that comes through a revelation from the Father made our Lord Jesus trusts Peter not only with the key to God's house but also to God's heart by guiding the community to be a channel of forgiveness.






Thus far, our collection for our displaced Maui students has yielded **\$4.682.00** We do anticipate that this number will go higher. Thank you so much for your generous support!
