## 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent

"Let it be done to me..."

When was the last time you heard God speaking to you? The gospel this Sunday recounts the story of the visit of the angel Gabriel to Mary with the good news: "You shall conceive and bear a son and give him the name Jesus." And after carefully listening and weighing the angel's message, she replied: "May it be done to me according to your word." With her simple yes to God's invitation, Mary opened the doors for the recreation of the world. Finally, salvation has come.

All because Mary listened. She heard the word and she acted on what she heard.

This story is also played out in our daily lives. God speaks His word to us. It might not be as dramatic as an angel appearing before our very eyes. It could be through an inspiring words we encounter during a homily or reflection. Or it could be an innocent rumbling of a child who spoke straight-forwardly of a simple truth. Or just a quiet knocking in our hearts as we spend a moment of quiet prayer or as we are moved by the beauty of creation. Indeed God speaks to us in many ways.

Like Mary, we too are graced by the Lord. He chose each one of us for a particular mission which nobody else can accomplish. And God is waiting for our Yes to this mission.

And come Christmas, Our yes can very well be the best gift we can offer to Our Lord Jesus, who, Himself said Yes to the Father's will and become "the Emmanuel – the "God with us."

New Norm Regarding Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion taking Communion to the Homebound

Bishop Silva requests every parish to place the following announcement in its weekly bulletin for three consecutive weeks:

In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.

St. Joseph Parish asks Eucharistic Ministers to the homebound to please give your pyx to the sacristan prior to Mass. Please label the pyx with the number of hosts you need. The pyxes will be placed on the altar during the preparation of gifts, so the hosts in them will be consecrated during the Eucharistic Prayer. After Communion and announcements, the priest will call up those who will take Communion to the homebound, give a blessing and hand your pyx back to you.

In this season of giving thanks we would like to extend a big thank you to each and everyone of you, groups and individuals for all that you have done to enhance our Advent and Christmas celebrations. From yard care and gardening, to donating flowers and plants, to donating your time and talent in making sure our parish is beautiful for all to see. We are truly grateful and blessed!






Recently, Fr. Poli posed this question to some of our parishioners, "*Why do you choose to remain a Catholic*?" Here are some of their responses:

So, what are your reasons?


