”... but whoever humbles himself will be exalted’

Humility is the mother of all virtues... It is in being humble that our love becomes real, devoted and ardent. (Mother Teresa of Calcutta)

In the Gospel Our Lord Jesus reminds of the importance of humility when he declares: “Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted.” Humility is more than just not drawing attention to oneself or not desiring always to be the first among the rest. Neither is humility about putting ourselves down and refusing to develop or put to use the gifts and talents we have been entrusted with. But rather it is acknowledging who we are in the eyes of the Lord and being grateful for every gift that He has blessed us with. Because in so doing, then we know how we can use these God-given gifts to truly serve. And our model will be the Lord Jesus, himself, who came not to be served but to serve!

In the Eucharist, Our Lord Jesus makes a gift of himself to us. His self-giving becomes now the call for us to likewise make a gift ourselves through the service we offer to our brothers and sisters, and through this, we are serving God. Our Eucharist becomes an empty ritual if it does not transform us to be a true disciple of the Lord and becomes his instrument in leading others back to the Lord.

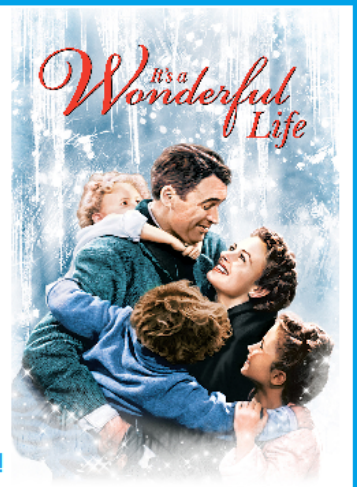
