Foolish or Wise

As we remember this month of November our faithful departed, we are being invited likewise to reflect on the reality of death. Not only that is inevitable but that it is a gateway that all must pass through in our journey towards fullness of life.

This Sunday's gospel of the parable of the foolish and wise virgins reminds us of the preparation that is necessary in the course of our earthly life. Our goal in life is to be ready to meet the bridegroom and light his path when he finally comes. And we either could be among the foolish ones who did not bring the needed extra oil to keep our lamps burning or we can be among the wise who made sure we are ready with those needed extra oil. With an exhortation at the end, we are told "So, stay awake, for you do not know the day or the hour."

And indeed, our readiness to face life daily is what also makes us ready to face death. It is when we live life in its fullness that we are most ready to meet the Bridegroom. Living life in its fullness is really dying every day. This was how Jesus lived His life, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.".. There are higher values than merely living a comfortable life. That is why we have heroes, martyrs, and saints among us. These are people who have literally died so that others may live. Hopefully we will be among them.
