29th Sunday of Ordinary Time – 2023 (A)

"... and to God what belongs to God's."

At the center of his Sunday's gospel is a Roman coin during the biblical times. This coin has the imprint of the face and title of the roman emperor that reads: "Caesar Augustus Tiberius, son of the Divine Augustus". This was the coin used for paying the census tax.

Such was the coin handed to Jesus as He responded to the dilemma brought in by the Pharisees when they posed the question whether they should pay the census tax to the Roman Emperor. Had He responded "Yes", He would be accused of cooperating with the Roman domination. Had He responded "No", He would be accused of inciting rebellion against the empire. So either way, the Pharisees thought they have cornered Jesus. But Jesus knew their intention and masterfully crushed them with his reply: "*Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God what belongs to God's.*"

The coin with the emperor's image was minted by the Romans and therefore belongs to the Romans. But wherever and whoever has the imprint of God belongs to the Lord. And we are reminded of the words in Genesis: 'Man is created in the image and likeness of God." We carry the image of God in us and consequently the whole of humanity belongs to God. Thus, we owe God our loyalty and obedience.

We belong to God. What a privilege and honor! How have we shown our gratitude and appreciation?

SPIRITUAL AND MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY.

"We all have burdens to bear in life. We move away from loved ones and friends. We lose a job or a significant part of our savings. We are anxious about performance at school or work. We are stricken with grief at the death of a loved one. We feel imprisoned by a destructive habit such as alcohol abuse or pornography. We are in a destructive relationship and do not know how to extricate ourselves from it."

We experience trauma at some life events, like what is happening in west Maui.

It is because of these normal kinds of challenges to our spiritual and mental health that the Diocese is introducing a SPIRITUAL AND MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY. This is not meant to take the place of mental health professionals. It is a ministry of accompaniment. A Handbook is available for your use.
