#### **ALOHA!**

Ua Kuluma Ke Kanaka I Ke Aloha. (It Is Natural For People To Behave In a Loving Way.)

For anyone who has set foot in Hawaii, "Aloha" would be a word that will have its imprint in their hearts. And by then "Aloha" is no longer just "Welcome or Goodbye", it will be "LOVE!"

In the Gospel, When Jesus was asked about the great commandment, without hesitation he responded, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, And with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And the second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as vourself. "

And the first thing to take note of: For Our Lord Jesus "Love" is first and foremost a verb- an action word more than a noun! As an action word it is manifested in the way we behave or do things. But more so in the way we live our lives! Do we behave in a loving way?

To love God with our whole being means to make God the center of our life. We think of God, we put God in the center of our plans and decision making, we ask ourselves if what we have done or about to do is in accord with the mind and heart of God. And all because God has loved us first!

Once God is at the center of our life, the second commandment is easier to follow, to love our neighbor. Notice the description of Jesus, "the second is like it." He likens the love of neighbor to the love of God. The two are inseparable.

But unfortunately, in our present society, we have made "Love" a thing even a commodity.

Let us rediscover the true Aloha and be the People of God who lives in Love!



#### SPIRITUAL AND MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY.

"We all have burdens to bear in life. We move away from loved ones and friends. We lose a job or a significant part of our savings. We are anxious about performance at school or work. We are stricken with grief at the death of a loved one. We feel imprisoned by a destructive habit such as alcohol abuse or pornography. We are in a destructive relationship and do not know how to extricate ourselves from it."

We experience trauma at some life events, like what is happening in west Maui.

It is because of these normal kinds of challenges to our spiritual and mental health that the Diocese is introducing a SPIRITUAL AND MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY. This is not meant to take the place of mental health professionals. It is a ministry of accompaniment. A Handbook is available for your use.
