## Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Our Lenten journey begins. We started with such an intense if not a dramatic imposition of the ashes last Wednesday to remind us not only of the fleetingness of our human existence but of the opportunity to start a new life with the Lord through a journey of repentance and conversion.

On this 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent, we recall the story of the temptation of Our Lord Jesus. He was not only tempted once but three times. And in all three instances, Our Lord came out victorious.

Looking in our own life journeys, we recognized that temptations are part of our human reality. We have experienced one time or another being lured into disobeying God's will in our lives in exchange for the world's promise of pleasure, power and prestige.

The fact of that Christ himself is tempted tells us that temptation is not yet a sin. It becomes evil or sinful when one willfully consent and succumb to the lure. "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." We have a choice and that we are not powerless before Satan. We have Jesus as our hope and strength.

Abstinence: refraining from eating meat.

Who has to...? Fast: For members of the Latin Rite, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through 59.

Abstain: Persons age 14 onwards.
