### 2nd Sunday of Lent - 2024 (B)

"...and led them up a high mountain"

Many of us grew up with the holy season of Lent as an invitation to go to a holy place and spent some time communing with the transcendence. This sense of the holy is deeply ingrained in our Catholic world. Any disrespectful behavior towards the holy is disdained or looked with contempt. But due to the influence of a more secular environment, this sense of the holy seems to be disappearing.

On this Second Sunday of Lent, we are reminded of those sacred encounters fo the people in the bible. In the first reading we have Abraham and Isaac in Mt. Horeb. In the Gospel, Jesus took Peter, James, and up a high mountain and there they witnessed Jesus' transfiguration. It seems that the high mountain is the place of an encounter with God.

During our Lenten journey, we, too, are being invited to go up the high mountain and enter a holy space where a meeting with God can take place. It does not have to be the Mauna Kea or Mauna Loa. It can just be that quiet space corner in our church or in your garden or home or even by the beach. What is needed is for us to lift up our hearts and mind to the Lord and allow Him to enter into our lives and allow the mystery of the transfiguration to unfold before us.

And less we forget Transfiguration is not to change a person to some one who is not but unfolding who we really are in the eyes of God. Thus, the voice of the Father that said: "This is my beloved son. Listen to Him." This is who Jesus truly is – the beloved son of the heavenly father.

## **FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

When do I...? Fast and Abstain: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday

Abstain: All Fridays during Lent

What is...?

Fasting: eating one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence: refraining from eating meat.

Who has to...? Fast: For members of the Latin Rite, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through 59.

Abstain: Persons age 14 onwards.

Note: persons exempt from fasting include the physically or mentally ill, individuals with chronic illness, and pregnant or nursing women.


