Then they abandoned their nets and followed him.

Our gospel this Sunday begins with the preaching of Jesus on coming of the kingdom of God. For Jesus, there are two essential prerequisites to be part of the Kingdom: first is to repent and second is to believe in the gospel. This means that one has experienced a kind of renewal that the person is willing to let go of the old self and be transformed to a new person who is captivated by Christ and His gospel.

And this is what the call of the first disciples of Jesus mirrors to us. The vocation stories of Simon and Andrew, and James and John tells us of the necessary transformation from being fishermen to becoming fishers of men! To leave their old ways of life and to embark into anew one with Christ was indeed a giant leap of faith. And we know they did not automatically changed into perfect disciples but their journey to becoming true followers of Christ began. They had a lot to learn but Jesus was patient enough to guide and form them.

But they sure were ready to leave their nets that entangled them from following Christ. We, too, are challenged by the Lord to let go of those that bind or entangle us with the world and begin the journey of a disciple of the Kingdom of God.

Let us remember this invitation of Jesus every time we pray: May your Kingdom come.
