5th Sunday of Lent – 2024

"Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies..."

Our Gospel this Sunday echoes the kind of life Our Lord Jesus was envisioning: "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." And this is also the kind of life Jesus calls his disciples to embrace. To live is not to wait what this life will be ready to give us. It is not about what we can get from this life but rather what we can give so that ours become a life-giving presence in the world. For Jesus it was necessary that He be ready to make the sacrifice of dying to self if there was to be a new life. This is a law of sacrifice.

But what does "dying to self" do to a person? When we choose to die to self like the grain of wheat, we are called to die or more concretely to let go of those things that keep us from living our lives with greater freedom to follow Jesus. And thus by dying to our self we actually experience new life - From a life centered on our ego to life lived for others; from a life of indifference to a life of compassion. From a self-preoccupied life to a life centered on God.

Like the bread that must be broken in order to be shared to others; and like the candle that must be consumed in order to give light, so also we must learn to give of ourselves, to die to ourselves, in order for others to live. In so doing, we make our own lives more meaningful and fruitful, for we are able to share fully in the life Jesus – a life of total self-giving. For truly, as beautifully put by St. Francis of Assisi, "it is in giving that we receive; it is in dying that we are born to eternal life."

When do I...? Fast and Abstain: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday Abstain: All Fridays during Lent What is...? Fasting: eating one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence: refraining from eating meat. Who has to...? Fast: For members of the Latin Rite, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through 59.

Note: persons exempt from fasting include the physically or mentally ill, individuals with chronic illness, and pregnant or nursing women.

Abstain: Persons age 14 onwards.
