The Solemnity of **All Saints** is coming up on November 1. It is an occasion to honor all the saints, canonized and uncanonized. In Hawaii we have two persons raised to the honors of the Altar: Blessed Damien who is going to be declared a Saint in the near future and Blessed Marianne Cope whose process is going on. What we should remember is that among the uncanonized we have so many of our own parents and relatives who have lived their commitment to the Lord and who are among the blessed in heaven. We are honoring them as well with this feast. It is a reminder to all of us that we are all, without exception, called to sanctity and we hope we will be rewarded with heaven at the end of our lives on earth. We will realize that goal in our lives when we too live our commitment to the Lord in whatever life situation we find ourselves. ## Sunday Reflection

Fr. John M. Mbinda

**October 26, 2008: Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A**

Readings: Exodus 22:20-26; 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10; Matthew 22:34-40

### First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26

The First Reading from Exodus focuses on the practice of the Law regarding relationship with those who are less fortunate. The passage shows that God gave the Law for the protection of the poor, the widow, the orphan and the stranger. We hear that God always hears the cry of such persons and treats them with compassion. The text shows that God also punishes with harshness anyone who mistreats them.

### Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51

Psalm 18 is a prayer of praise to God for his compassion shown in victory and deliverance. Response: "I love you, Lord, my strength."

### Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10

In this passage, Paul reminds the Thessalonians that the Church grows by the power of the Holy Spirit. However, the pattern of growth is by imitation. Imitation of God is fundamental to both the Hebrew and the Christian Scriptures. We can imitate one another, as well, insofar as we are signs of God to one another. Imitation of Jesus is basic to the spread of Christianity, but here Paul speaks of the Thessalonians imitating him, and in turn becoming models for others.

### Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

In the Gospels we find three accounts of the great commandment. Each of them has its own characteristic. Here in Matthew, the question is put to Jesus in bad faith as a test. The two great commandments as Jesus gives them in this passage are from Deuteronomy 6:4-5 and Leviticus 19:18. The concluding verse (v 40) is found only in Matthew. "The law and the prophets" refers to the entire structure of Jewish faith and life. Thus, these two commandments support the whole structure, which crumbles if either one is neglected. This is a pointed allusion to the Pharisees who preferred to discuss the finer points of the law, while ignoring the actual obligation to love God and others.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Diocese of Honolulu:

Peace be with you!

We are all probably very weary of the Presidential campaigns by now. We have heard debates and speeches, seen blogs, read newspaper articles, and seen opinion polls. No matter what the polls may have said at any given moment, there is only one opinion poll that matters, and that is the vote itself. One of the candidates will emerge victorious because of the people who supported him with their votes.

I urge all of you to cast your vote on November 4. It is our civic responsibility. But I ask you in these final days before the election to pray over the choices, to reflect upon the values of the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to make an informed choice.

There are many issues to consider: war, the economy, ecology, the stability of the family, health care, education, the elimination of poverty at home and abroad. Among the many issues to be weighed, however, one issue alone far outweighs all others: the right to life. Without life, all other issues do not matter. It is the right to life that is fundamental. Abortion in a special way is an issue that we need to focus on, since it is a violation of the human rights of human beings who are so vulnerable they cannot speak for or defend themselves. It is the most widespread – and the only legal – form of domestic violence. It is a cancer that erodes our respect for one another in many different ways. It is a hidden source of anger, depression and denial for those who cannot admit what they know in their heart of hearts, that it is the deliberate taking of the life of a real human girl or boy.

I have often heard the slogan, “You cannot legislate morality.” It is meant to say that there are different opinions and no law can make people do what is right. However, I think the slogan is false. If we cannot legislate morality, then what is it we do legislate? Why is there a need for government at all, if not to articulate and guide society in doing what is right and just? Is that not what morality is? Respect for one another, and the most fundamental respect for life are the bases of all morality and all law. All government officials must serve not by doing what is convenient or popular, but by insisting on higher values for the good of all in society, especially the most vulnerable.

I urge all to vote. But before you do, please pray about what the Lord wants us to do in our society, about what the gospel of Jesus demands. Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Pray for the strength to do what is right not only in the election but in the years that will follow it, so that we can all remain citizens who are faithful to the Lord and Giver of Life.

What was said or not said during this long campaign matters only now in how it leads us to vote for our new President and other leaders of government. May the Lord enlighten and guide you!

## **IMPORTANT PARISH-WIDE MEETING**

**THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20,  
7:00 PM AT ST. JOSEPH CHURCH**

Since May 27, forty-seven of your fellow parishioners have been working as a TEAM on the various aspects of creating our parish hall. Now, the Design, Site Development and At-Large sub-teams have, in collaboration, completed the preliminary process of developing three different building designs and calculating the estimated costs for each one.

Now it is your turn. All of you who worship together every weekend are now asked to do your part. That is to choose the building you believe will best serve the needs of this community. On November 20<sup>th</sup> the decision will be made as to what plan will be presented to the Diocese.

Everything will be explained and illustrated thoroughly. There will be a time for questions, comments, suggestions, etc. After all the presentations have been made, the questions answered, and the adjustments, if any, considered, a vote will be taken by a simple show of hands. Don't miss the opportunity to be counted. Help us move a step closer to our long-delayed dream of a parish hall.

## Baptism

For the grace of Baptism to unfold, the parents' help is important. So too is the role of the *godfather* and *godmother*, who must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized - child or adult on the road of Christian life.<sup>55</sup> Their task is a truly ecclesial function (*officium*).<sup>56</sup> The whole ecclesial community bears some responsibility for the development and safeguarding of the grace given at Baptism.

## Malia Puka O Kalani Church

The following individuals volunteered and were subsequently appointed by Fr. Thomas, pastor, to be on the Malia Finance Committee: Ron Schurra, Kathleen Yamamoto, Joseph Costa, Laverne Costa, Moses Moke, Samantha Naipo-Arsiga. David Watson, Business Manager, is a nonvoting member. Natalie McKeen is a non voting secretary. Fr. Thomas requested that I, Fr. Joe, be his customary delegate as President. The first meeting of the newly reconstructed Finance Committee was held on Oct 16, 2008. The following is a summary of the minutes: 1. The Diocese is developing a new set of standards for parish Finance Committees. It will be distributed to the members as soon as it is approved. Until it is approved, the members requested that Fr. Joe chair the meetings. After promulgation of the new standards, the committee will elect a chairperson. 2. Dave Watson reported that Malia presently has \$11,150.00 in the operation account. This includes the donations from the weekly offerings as well as the monthly rent (\$650.00) from the parish hall. The parish also has \$40,000.00 in savings which the Committee agreed would be saved for a "rainy day" and not touched for operations. 3. The Committee unanimously recommended that Fr. Tom sign a one year lease with Kako'o Ka Umeke (Pre-School) for the exclusive use of the area of the building popularly known as the Religious Education Section. The lease fee would be \$1,500.00 per month with Ka Umeke doing all the needed repairs. 4. The Committee unanimously agreed to recommend to Fr. Tom that he sign a proposal to replace the existing trim and screening in the front section of the parish hall. (This has been a needed repair for some time) The total project will cost \$4,800.00. 5. The next meeting of the Parish Finance Committee is scheduled for Thursday, Nov 20 at 7:00 pm.

The gratitude of the entire parish goes to those who have volunteered and been appointed to be guardians and stewards of the material goods of the parish. The above is a brief summary of the meeting and not the official minutes. Fr. Joe

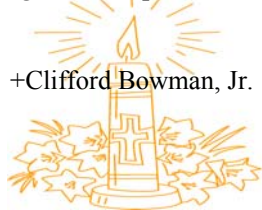

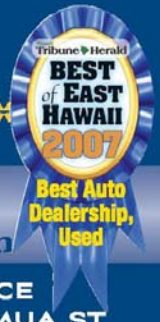
