Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21, 2010

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are easily outraged by the corruption and sin around us. We follow with interest and with a certain feeling of self-righteousness the stories of famous people who go through a crisis because of their sins and indiscretions.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus invites us to look into our hearts. His answer to those who would condemn the woman caught in adultery applies to us as well:

"He who has no sin be the first to cast a stone."

We may be better off than other people, but not because we are less of a sinner than they. It is because we are not exposed for what we are. But God sees into our hearts. He tells us not to condemn easily because we ourselves are in need of his forgiveness.



As we approach the holiest of weeks let us be more forgiving. Let us remember that our God is rich in kindness and abounding in mercy. God bless you,

A Reflection: **Forgive and Remember: A journey to Unity and Peace**

A sense of self-righteousness is like looking through a magnifying glass. A magnifying glass enlarges a small portion of an object and excludes the rest. When we look at another person through the magnifying glass of self-righteousness, we exaggerate behavior which triggers anger, jealousy, and revenge. We fail to see the whole person, the good qualities, the rich past relationship, the quality times we had together, our shared humanity. The only way to regain a full picture of the other person is to put down the magnifying glass of self-righteousness. This can only be accomplished by forgiving. When we forgive, we then are able to see the other person in his/her totality; only then are we able to remember the other person in his/her richness and goodness and in our shared humanity.

In today's Gospel, the Scribes and Pharisees looked with self-righteousness at the woman

caught in adultery. This triggered anger and revenge. They positioned themselves to stone her until Jesus asked them to put down the magnifying glass of self-righteousness. He told them to look at the woman in front of them, cowering in fright and to see their shared humanity and remember themselves. This process of forgiving and remembering was, for the Scribes, the Pharisees, and the woman caught in adultery the first step in a journey to unity and peace. And so it is for us.

"It all depends on how you look at it"

What I mean by that saying is that the knowledge and perspective we bring to any experience determines how we feel about that experience. For example, those old enough to remember the postwar era might recall scenes of big, modern factories belching smoke—hailed as a sign of prosperity. Now, we may look at such scenes with a sensitivity to environmental issues; our perspective is different. It all depends on how you look at it.

This Sunday's Scriptures invite a similar change of perspective: Isaiah urges the people to forget about the Exodus-event, the passage through the Red Sea. Instead, the people are to take notice that God is doing something new. Paul tells the Philippians how knowing Christ has caused him to consider everything else as "rubbish." And Jesus himself turns accusation into forgiveness with a simple phrase inviting the scribes and Pharisees to look at a sinner from the perspective of their own sinfulness.

Lent is a time to alter our way of looking at ourselves and our world. What surprises await us this week, as we re-orient ourselves, based on our coming to know Jesus Christ.

COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE:

We will have a Lenten Communal Penance Service on Saturday, March 27 at 8:30 am. This Penance Service will have the opportunity for individual confession and absolution. You are requested to please be present by 8:30 am because we will begin promptly. This will be the last Communal Penance Service before Holy Week and Easter.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER:

Please consider planning your schedule so that you and your family can participate in the liturgies of the Holiest Week of the Year. The liturgy schedule at Malia is as follows:

Palm Sunday: Mass at 5:15 pm Saturday and 9:00 am Sunday. Mass will start with the blessing of the palms in the patio area followed by a procession into the church.

Holy Thursday: Mass of the Last Supper at 7:00 pm. This will include the symbolic washing of the feet. Following the Mass there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the altar of repose (in the first floor of the rectory) until 10:00 pm. There is a sign-up sheet at the entrance to church. It is not necessary to sign-up. However, we want to make sure someone is with the Blessed Sacrament at all times. If you can commit to a half hour time slot, we will be able to rest secure that someone will be with the Blessed Sacrament at all times until 10:00 pm. There will be coffee and juice available in the hall until 10:00. Please keep the area around the Altar of Repose (including the patio) quiet.

Good Friday: We will celebrate the Good Friday Liturgy at 1:00 pm. This will include the Veneration of the Cross and Communion.

We will have Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm. The Stations will be in the church and will include a repeat of the Good Friday Homily given at the service earlier in the day.

Holy Saturday: During the day on Holy Saturday we will decorate the church and the hall for the Easter Celebrations. Please bring tropical flowers and come to help change our church/hall from the Lenten austerity to the Easter glory.

The Easter Vigil will be celebrated at 7:00 pm. The Blessing of the Fire and the Blessing of the Easter Candle will take place in the patio followed by a procession into the church. This wonderful service of light is rather lengthy and not necessarily conducive for small children.

Following the Easter Vigil Celebration we will have soup and bread in the patio.

Easter Sunday: We will celebrate Easter Sunday with a Mass at 9:00 am. This Mass will be a Family Mass with a special focus on the children (much like our Christmas Eve Mass). The Mass will be celebrated in the parish Hall.



THE ROOF PROJECT:

We are three Quarters of the way toward our goal. At this time, we have a bit over \$9,000.00 in pledges and payments. This is absolutely outstanding! We have only \$3,000.00 to go to meet our goal. If you have not yet made a roof commitment, please consider helping to reach our goal before Easter. We will soon sign the contract to begin the project. 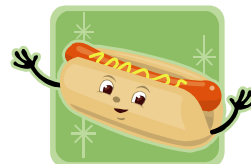
