Scripture Readings

Roman Missal—Third Edition

- The First Sunday of Advent is fast approaching when we will begin using the new English translation of the Roman Missal—Third Edition. This month we will explore some more changes to the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
- While the assembly has to learn some new responses, the priest-celebrant has to learn much more. All of the prayers, including the Eucharistic Prayers, have been revised and I would like to point out some differences that you will hear when they are prayed.
- First, as with all of the Presidential Prayers, you will notice a more formal tone. In our tradition, communal prayer—distinct from individual prayer—has always had a more formal quality about it. Liturgical speech is not casual conversation, but a solemn dialogue between God and his people.
- An example of more formal language that we already use in the liturgy is the Our Father and the works "hallowed be they name." "Hallowed" and "thy" are not everyday words and yet we have become accustomed to them and understand their meaning. This formal tone will certainly be more evident throughout the Roman Missal—Third Edition.
- There are two noticeable changes to the Institution Narrative of the Eucharistid Prayers:
 - One is the repeated use of the "**chalice.**" Currently, we use the word "cup," but the new translation uses 'chalice" to refer to the specific type of cup we use for the Eucharist.
 - Another change is that the words "shed for you and for all" have been revised to read "poured out for you and for many." The new words are a more lit eral translation of the Latin "pro multis." In the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper, Jesus also says the words "for many" when speaking of those for whom he is establishing the New Covenant (Mt. 26:28 and Mk 14:24). To emphasize the Scriptural connection, we will pre same words that Jesus prayed. However, it remains our Catholic faith that Christ indeed died for all and the words "for many" should not be understood as limiting or exclusive with regard to the objects of his sacrificial love, namely all people, indeed all creation.
- The Memorial Acclamations have also been revised to reflect the long-standing tradition that they be specifically addressed to Christ. The most popular one, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again" will no longer be used because it is a statement about Christ rather than a prayer addressed to him. It will now read "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again."
- The other Memorial Acclamations have also been revised slightly.
- Next month we will conclude our series by exploring the Communion Rite and the Concluding Rites of the Mass
