"Stay with us, Lord, for it is nearly evening". After walking together for seven miles, this was the most appropriate offer of hospitality that the two disciples can share with this stranger who had been with them along the way. Besides, did not this stranger keep their hearts burning as he spoke and opened the scriptures for them just when they were feeling dejected with the turns of events those past few days.

That evening at Emmaus might have been a night of doubt, uncertainty and confusion but as Christians, we know that every night is always followed by the dawn of faith and hope brought about by the presence of the Risen Lord. Thus, "Stay with us, Lord." is also the prayer of the early Church to the Risen Lord that he not abandon them in their searching for his new presence.

How about us? Do we sincerely invite the Lord to stay with us?

To invite somebody into our house is to be willing to break our routine and put up with some inconveniences for the sake of the guest. The most important gift that one receives during these occasions is the gift of time, good conversations, and attention. The invitation, "Stay with us," means the one being invited is somebody important to us. That we treasure the person's presence! So significant that it can influence and transform our lives.

The return of the two disciples from Jerusalem to Emmaus was a pilgrimage of faith -- of lost and found faith. And so will be the journey of everyone who has made it there ardent plea: "To stay with us Lord."

During that time Ryan' mom stayed with Ryan, while his dad and grandmother, from Hilo took turns going to Ohio to support mom and Ryan. After two failed stemcell therapies, Ryan underwent a successful bone marrow transplant in Ohio's Cincinnati Children's Medical Center, Ryan was discharged to finally return home in Hilo last August. After two months in isolation, he is now preparing to start preschool.

Last Easter season, the family prayed for a miracle. This Easter the family celebrates the miracle and thanks and praises God for his kindness and love. Ryan's life and successful treatment are due to prayers and God's merciful love.




May, A Month for our Mother

The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1). The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore the example, as well as the guide and

inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church, seeks to be the servant of God and man and the obedient agent of the promptings of the Holy Spirit. In our observance of the Marian month we should consider the season of the Liturgical Year which largely corresponds with the fifty days of Easter. Our pious exercises could emphasize Our Lady's participation in the Paschal mystery and in Pentecost with which the Church begins. The pious exercises connected with the month of May can easily highlight the earthly role played by the glorified Queen of Heaven, here and now, in the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
