

Who are we serving?

We are all stewards of the time, talent, and treasure God has entrusted to us. And one day, we will give an accounting not just of what we had but what we did with it. But the question for us now is, how are we preparing for this day of accounting?

The Gospel presents the parable of the steward who was accused of wasting his master's possessions. Shrewdly, the steward reduced the debts of his master's clients so they would welcome him later. Surprisingly, the steward was commended not for his dishonesty but for his shrewdness, for his ability to act cleverly in a difficult situation.

We, too, are called to a certain "spiritual shrewdness" in terms of where we are investing for our future. We need to use what we have now to prepare for what truly matters. People are astute and crafty when it comes to taking care of their earthly affairs. But should we not give more thought to taking care of our relationship with God?

Time with God, care for people in need, and living in grace are good investments. As stewards of the Lord, we must remember "No servant can serve two masters. One cannot serve both God and mammon."




May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
