The Rich Man and Lazarus

Are you praying for God's miracle to change the world?

Celebrate!

(PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY)

Today's Gospel provides with a striking contrast. At the beginning we have a rich man in fine clothes feasting and a hungry poor man lying at his doorsteps longing for scraps. Then seemingly at the end of their lives there was a change of fate – the rich man suffering in eternal flames and the poor man Lazarus resting in the bosom of Abraham.

First of all, the parable is not condemning wealth, nor is it glorifying poverty. Rather, Jesus is warning us about the great spiritual danger of indifference. The rich man's failure was not because he acquired wealth wrongfully. The rich man's sin was not what he did, but what he failed to do. He simply ignored the poor man, Lazarus. He walked past him and was blind to his fellow man's suffering.

But more importantly, while their situation changed, the attitude did not. The rich man only saw Lazarus as the poor man who can only be at his beck and call. And Lazarus on the other hand remained quiet at the side of Abraham. This is not to frighten us, but to awaken us. Hopefully we open our eyes and our hearts to the words of Jesus in the Gospel and not wait for an extra ordinary crisis to remind us. Sometimes we pray for miracles to happen so that things in our world will get better. Our world does not need more miracles – it needs more mercy. And each one of us can very well be the channel of God's mercy.


Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)
